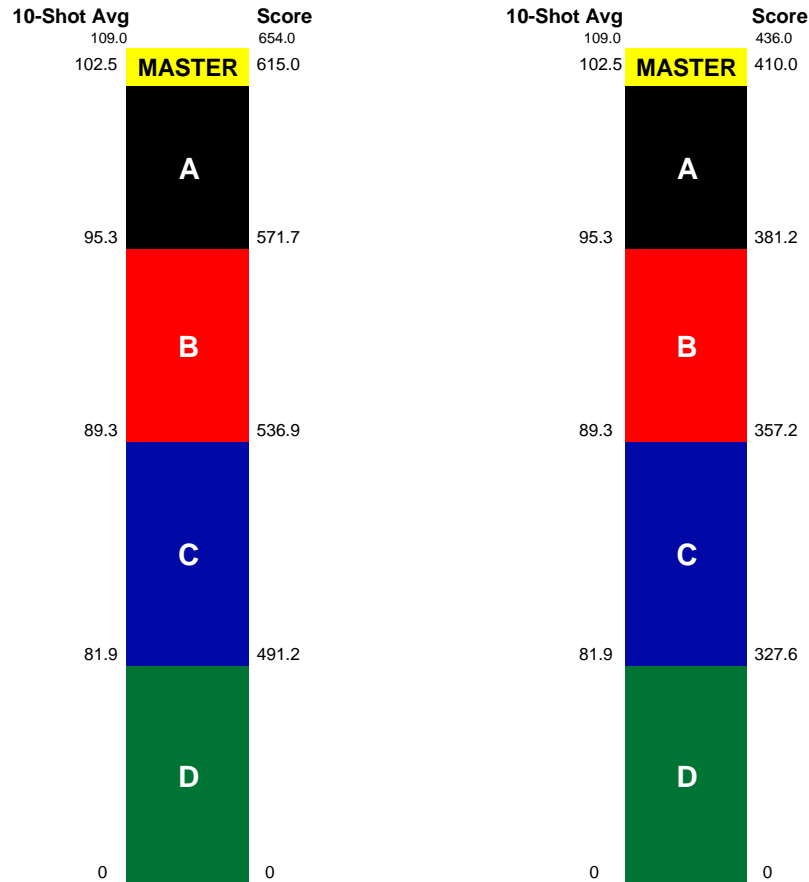


# NTSA Air Classification Chart 2016

## 60 Shot Match

## 40 Shot Match



For a shooter's first competition, he/she will automatically start in the D class - unless he/she declares as a certain class.

For second, third and subsequent competitions, a shooter's class will be based on the 10-shot average of his/her previous competitions.

Averages from a shooter's three most immediate previous competitions (where applicable) will be used to calculate his/her class.

For example, a shooter whose last three competition scores are 545.3, 551.9 and 565.4 will have a three match average of 554.2. This will give him/her a 10-shot average of 92.4 over the 3 matches. As this 10-shot average falls between 89.3 and 95.3, this shooter will be graded as Class B.

The class list will comprise of shooters and averages from the last six NTSA calendar competitions only.

All competitors will be graded based on the scores shot prior to the first detail of the competition and will remain at that grading for the duration of the competition.

Shooters can declare for a higher class if they wish to.

**Note on Master Class:** A shooter who achieves the grading of 'Master' will receive an award in recognition of this achievement, to be presented by the NTSA committee, within a year of the second competition at which the grading was achieved.
